D. **PUBLIC COMMENT** (5 min)

Jim Plehn was introduced. He represenates a film production company interested in the making the book "A Wall of White" into a feature film. His role would be as a technical specialist if the film were to happen.

He provided a handout and gave a presentation on the production and what they want from SAC. They want a 501(c) to run donation money through for start up funding for the production.

Board had a discussion on the merits of the film. Some money would be made from a percentage of the donations.

SAC made no commitment.

E. CORRESPONDENCE (10 min)

Jenny had received a request from Liftopia for a blog. Apparently Liftopia asks each of its partners to develop a blog for a month, SAC was asked to do February. Jenny will provide more details to Don T. prior to implementation.

F. Board Membership Changes

Jerome has requested to step down from a Board member position due to conflicts with his work schedule. He will move to the advisory board. He expressed an interest to stay involved with SAC. The Board thanked him for his service and contributions.

David Bunker has expressed interest in joining the board. He was unable to attend this meeting due to illness. He will attend the next meeting for introductions and election.

Jenny will make the appropriate changes on the roster.

G. FOREST SERVICE REPORT – Dennis Hogan (30 min)

Denny announced he will be taking a detail to work with the National Avalanche Center. His duties will include coordinating and evaluating the avalanche centers across the nation and coordinating the avalanche artillery program. He will still be the SAC representative and be available.

Denny thanked SAC from prompt payment of the Collection Agreement bill.

Board had a discussion on moving forward in teaching avy courses for the snowmobile community. The need for a special use permit came up. due to illnessDenny rendered the opinion that SAC would need one for teaching the avy courses and he will help through the process. SAC needs to apply for one soon. The costs associated are: \$103 application fee, approximate 3% fee for gross revenue and an annual insurance policy.

Discussion continued with the fact that the revenue collected by the USFS could come back to SAC due to the Type Code on the permit.

Some of the discussion topics included: Offer for free? Offer both free and paid classes? Not a money maker for SAC, object will be to break even. Will need a contract instructor(s). Forecasters will not be able to participate in the actual instruction if fee charged.

Concensuses was to move forward with the permit process.

Forecasters

Snowpack continuing to diminish, Andy showed his damaged skis. Avalanche danger currently in isolated pockets or gullies. Outlook for a major storm is not good.

Board thanked the forecasters for the high quality postings on the web site.

H. **TREASURER'S REPORT –** Randall Osterhuber (10 min)

I. PROGRAM MANAGER REPORT

Jenny gave a summary of the attached report and ski days scenario.

Jenny reviewed a revised marketing plan for ski days that had not been distributed earlier.

Ski day banners placement has been arranged in Truckee and So Tahoe. 4 spots in Truckee. 1 spot in So. Tahoe.

She will prepare a Thank You letter to Squaw Valley for the Gold Pass that was awarded in December. SAC raised \$7,861 in the drawing.

J. COMMITTEE REPORTS (20 min)

a. President's Report – Don Triplett

Don, Jenny and Holly will be attending the Outdoor Retailer show in Salt Lake city this month. The purpose will to be make contacts of potential sponsors and attend a Board Presidents forecasters meeting scheduled with the show.

SAC has been approached by the Squaw Valley Patrol to partner in the sponsorship of the annual Steep and Deep seminars held at Squaw Valley. SAC will be partnering with the Patrol and Marketing Departments. The revenues made have historically been presented to applicants for avalanche education as a scholarship. This would continue.

Snowmobile Update: Reno Polaris interested in working with SAC to gain new machines with a clear title. May cost SAC about \$5,000 to upgrade.

Marketing Proposal: Briefed the board on the on-gong efforts to contract with a marketing firm to help promote SAC activities. Currently have 2 proposals under consideration. This will be costly. Board discussion: cost too high, need someone like this and we need to refine the proposed tasks. This will be a big step.

Don and Bob will continue pushing forward to refine SAC needs.

K. NEW BUSINESS

Insurance Discussion: Bob still presuing a new insurance carrier. AGIS in Truckee has been slow to respond with a quote. Current insurance renewed. Our needs will be increasing with the Special Use Permit requirements. *Bob will be meeting with AGIS to go over our needs and if the broker feels are current policy is adequate beyond the Director's insurance.

Due to restrictions on conducting a raffle this year, SAC had attendees of TAFF sign-up to our mailing list and raffled off a Heli-trip to Cordova Alaska thanks to the generous efforts of Board Member Todd Offenbacher. Roughly, 486 new contacts were obtained. Board members have divided the data entry efforts so that we can add these new contacts to SalesForce and Constant Contact.
